WEEDS IN MY GARDEN HOW NEGLECT CAN CREATE PROBLEMS

One week ago, I surveyed the weeds growing in my yard.

There were a lot there, but they were only small, so I left them.

Today, after rain and warm weather, those little weeds, which were only a few centimetres high, are now strong and healthy plants up to a metre in height.

What would have been a relatively easy problem to deal with, has now become a much harder, and more time consuming task.

How much like life this is! We see things that we acknowledge as needing to be fixed, and tell ourselves that we will get to it one day. Then we find that it is much more difficult to overcome.

We may see wrong attitudes in our children, which are actually a mirror image of ourselves! There are habits that we know we have developed over the years, that we tell ourselves we will change one day. There is the neglect of family and friends, where we really did intend to visit, or email or call, but just did not take the time.

Perhaps you made a promise to yourself last year, that you would get to church at Easter. But that promise was neglected. The hot cross buns and Easter eggs are now prompting you that it is time to deal with this area of neglect. The longer we leave it, the harder it is to return.

I know that the children at Jubilee are getting lots of good teaching about the true meaning of Easter, but that is no substitute for each of us as parents to neglect our own personal contact with the true reason for Easter this year.

All the churches connected with Jubilee will be open and welcoming to all who wish to attend and celebrate Easter with us. Details of these services are included in this edition of the Jubilee Newsletter.

Don't neglect those little weeds that you have noted as areas of concern. The sooner they are attended to, the better the garden of your life will become.

Have a happy and Christ filled Easter.

A MOMENT'S THOUGHT

Catherine and I were on our way to our nephew's birthday party one rainy Saturday morning driving along what some people call moose alley. It was early, few other cars on the road and we were looking forward to a good day spent with family. It wasn't that we hadn't driven this road before, in fact, many, many times through the bush-laden countryside. Suddenly seemingly out of nowhere, a moose darted out across our path. Fortunately, a quick swerve to the other lane prevented a full impact with only a collision on the right side of our car ripping off the mirror and embedding moose hair down the side of the car, and knocking the moose to the pavement.

By the time I stopped and looked back in my rear view mirror, the moose was getting up and then ran into the bush. Shaken but fine, we both looked at each other with a stunned expression. We both knew that moose accidents had claimed many lives throughout the years, and we knew we had been very fortunate to escape with only slight vehicle damage and no personal injury or worse. After a quick check of our vehicle, we started off again.

It took only a few seconds from start to finish in our moose accident but those few seconds in our lives have reverberated through time to this day. Why?

We had often talked about the frailty of life, the here today and gone tomorrow potential we all face but it had never been so personally realistic before. And, it wasn't that we haven't had friends, relatives, and colleagues die before, it was now much more personal. In the matter of seconds, lives can be irreversibly altered; death could have easily been the result.

The value of that one near miss with death has been a positive, a reawakening to the value of each day. Each one of us has only a limited time on this earth; no one can predict when your time will end. But, the time between life and death is a time to give thanks for each day, to see the sun rise again, to know that you can accomplish, can help, can assist others to appreciate their life if they are caught in the poor-me syndrome.

This moose accident also came to mind recently when the rebellion in Libya hit the news. A situation where lives can be changed in a flash, where a leader is killing his citizens knowing full well that lives seem only to be a commodity to be taken not preserved or helped. Every day we in the western world often take each day for granted, where far too many of us complain incessantly about not being able to do what we really want prevented in fact by our own lack of seizing the moment and where we have every opportunity to express ourselves.

Can you imagine how different your life would be if you awoke as a citizen in Libya today? Does this thought send shivers through your body and cause you to reflect whether you may not see tomorrow? It should.

I think the message is clear. Seize each day as if it is your last because that just might be the case. Take each day for the real gift it is; enjoy each day and add a joyful thought or a laugh or a simple appreciation to sit for a moment and enjoy the expression of freedom that it entails. You have a gift, a gift that is immeasurable in its own right. You can make each day a day of value, or you can chose to complain where you have the right to. What kind of day will you have now?


G'day from the APA

Dear Parents,

Jesus told them,

Let us go alone to a quiet place and rest for a while."

Our busy and very long first term is now drawing to a close. Teachers and students are certainly looking forward to a break!

Over the years we have all become familiar with the advertising campaign which urges us to recognise the signs of driver fatigue and 'Stop, Revive, Survive.' This little slogan is the perfect reminder for us all not just on the roads, but also in our daily schedules. We need to take some time out of our busy schedules to 'Stop, Revive, Survive'. We are all too familiar we the societal pressures to 'go, go, go'. Sometimes the very best thing we can do for ourselves and our families is to stop listening to the pressure to be busy and instead enjoy the stillness.

Meditation is a powerful practice to encourage greater stillness for you. It is a way of prayer that leads us into the silence in the centre of our beings. The World Community for Christian Meditation (http://www.wccm.org) provides the following process for Christian meditation:

Sit down. Sit still and upright. Close your eyes lightly. Sit relaxed but alert. Silently, interiorly begin to say a single word. We recommend the prayer phrase, Maranatha. Listen to it as you say it, gently but continuously. Do not think or imagine anything spiritual or otherwise. If thoughts and images come, these are distractions at the time of meditation, so keep returning to simply saying the word. Meditate twenty to thirty minutes each morning and evening.

The times for Church Services over Holy Week and Easter are also advertised in this newsletter. As a Christian School we encourage families to participate as fully as possible in their Church community throughout the holiday period.

As a school community Jubilee will celebrate an Easter Worship on Thursday 28 April at 9:00am in the Multi Purpose Centre (or as a back up, the Bottom Covered Area).






